

**REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL  
RIFLES AND SHOTGUNS  
FOR THE NAVAJO POLICE DEPARTMENT**

**I. PURPOSE OF REQUEST.**

The Navajo Police Department (NPD) of the Navajo Nation is requesting proposals for the purchase of twenty (20) rifles and twenty (20) shotguns with mandator accessories for police officers of the Navajo Police Department. The selection will be based on overall price, services, performance and reliability of the proposers. The NPD's needs are outlined in the following Request for Proposal ("RFP").

**II. TIME SCHEDULE.**

It is the NPD's intent to follow the following process and timetable, resulting in the selection of a vendor. At the NPD's discretion, it may change the estimated dates and the process set forth below as it deems necessary including but not limited to interviews.

- C. All proposals must be in a sealed envelope and clearly marked "**NPD RIFLES AND SHOTGUNS BID NUMBER. 18-03-1797-VJ**". The name and address of the proposing vendor must be shown on the face of the envelope.
- D. All proposals must be received by 5:00pm on Friday, April 13, 2018. Proposals will not be accepted after this deadline. Three (3) copies of the proposal must be enclosed in the sealed envelope. No facsimile, electronic or telephone proposals will be accepted.
- E. Proposals should be prepared simply and economically, providing a straight forward, concise description of provider capabilities to satisfy the requirements of the request. Special bindings, colored displays, promotional materials, etc. are not desired. Emphasis should be on completeness and clarity of content.
- F. The NPD will notify proposers of the outcome of their proposals on or near the date indicated in the above time schedule.
- G. Proposal Submittal must include:
1. Description of the proposers' experience and capabilities in delivering the identified quantity of rifles and shotguns to government and law enforcement agencies.
  2. Proposer must include in their RFP a list of three (3) organizations, including points of contact, that can be used as references. Selected organizations may be contacted to determine the quality of work and delivery of weapons.
  3. Provide insight describing the education and work experience for the key staff who would be assigned to provide the weapons
  4. Identify from what location the proposer will provide service to the NPD.
  5. Description of the availability of weapons and estimated delivery times.
  6. The total cost of the quantity of rifles and shotguns.
  7. Provide shipping costs for the quantity of weapons.
  8. A completed W-9 Form (Exhibit B)
  9. A Navajo Nation Certification Regarding Debarment and Suspension (Exhibit C)

**IV. SELECTION CRITERIA.**

<b>CRITERIA</b>	<b>WEIGHT GIVEN</b>
1. Responsiveness of the written proposal to the purpose and scope of service, completeness and clarity of all required information and any supplemental information provided by the Proposer that will demonstrate the quality of services.	40 POINTS
2. Price.	50 POINTS
3. Ability, experience, financial resources and history of successfully completing contracts of this type, meeting projected deadlines and experience in similar work, location, the character, integrity, reputation, judgment and efficiency of the Proposer.	10 POINTS
<b>TOTAL CRITERIA WEIGHT</b>	<b>100 POINTS</b>

Each proposal will be independently evaluated on Criteria1 through 3.

**V. SCOPE OF SERVICES.**

The scope of service to be covered are attached herein as Exhibit A.

**VI. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.**

- A. The NPD reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, and to waive minor irregularities in any proposal.
- B. The NPD reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted, and to request additional information from any proposer.
- C. The NPD reserves the right to award all or a portion of the required services to more than one qualified proposer at the NPD's sole discretion.
- D. The contract resulting from acceptance of a proposal by the NPD shall be in a form supplied or approved by the NPD, and shall reflect the specifications in this RFP. A sample contract is attached as Exhibit B for informational purposes. If a Proposer has any exceptions to the terms of the sample contract, these must be submitted for consideration with the proposal. Otherwise, the Proposer will be deemed to have accepted the form of the Agreement. The NPD will not consider changes to its indemnification and insurance.
- E. After preliminary selection and prior to contract award, the NPD will meet with the Proposer to review procedures for invoicing, payment, reporting, if any, and monitoring contract performance.
- F. The NPD shall not be responsible for any costs incurred by the Proposer in

preparing, submitting or presenting its response to this RFP.

**VII. COMPENSATION**

- A. Present detailed information the firm's proposed fee schedule for the specifications proposed and for any variation for the non-routine services, inclusive of Navajo Nation sales tax and any other applicable governmental charges. Provide specifics as to definitions of routine versus non-routine tasks, what is fixed as opposed to variable, and how costs are adjusted according to that classification.
- B. Payment by the NPD for the services will only be made after the services have been performed and accepted by authorized NPD representatives. The NPD requires that all its vendors have a Department of Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form W-9 on file with the NPD to accommodate payment. Itemized billings shall be submitted upon completion containing information specified by the NPD as described in Exhibit A.

**VIII. LICENSE REQUIREMENT**

Proposer must be licensed in the Navajo Nation if performing the services on the Nation or they must be license in the state where the service will be provided.

**EXHIBIT A**  
**SCOPE OF SERVICE**

**GENERAL PROVISIONS**

The successful proposer must be able to provide twenty (20) rifles and twenty (20) shotguns that are described under the scope of purchase requirements of this exhibit. Each rifle will be equipped with three (3) magazines and the accessories identified in the scope of work for each rifle and shotgun build.

The Navajo Police Department's firearm lead has conducted an assessment and evaluation of weapon platforms. It is his recommendation the following build scopes meet the requirements of the Department. The specific requirements are identified below and should be represented in the proposal the Proposer submits. All weapons and parts must be new, in the box and come with the manufacturer's warranty and manual. The weapons will have a guarantee against defects. The weapons will contain a unique serial number that cannot be duplicated or altered.

## **A. RIFLE BUILD**

1. 16" Mid-Length Barrel - 4150 CMV, Chrome Lined, 1:8 Twist, Radiograph Inspected - Medium Contour
2. 13.5" rail M-LOK with QD mounts on both ends.
  - i. Allows the attachment of various rail mounted accessories.
  - ii. Manufactured from 6061-T6 aluminum
  - iii. Beveled ends to reduce snagging and eliminate sharp corners and edges
  - iv. Handguard weight Not to exceed 10.5oz
3. NP3 Coated M16 Bolt Carrier Group - Carpenter 158 Bolt - HP/MP Tested –
4. Ambidextrous Selector
5. Enhanced Mil-Spec Trigger - Nickel Teflon Coated
6. QD End Plate
7. Front and Rear Sights
  - i. All steel, low profile sights with Melonite finish.
  - ii. Combined weight shall not exceed 3.3oz for front and rear sights.

  - i. Not to exceed Weight: 9.6 oz.
  - ii. Mounts on mil-spec sized carbine receiver

  - vi. Minimum: #8 Deluxe Zipper & Zipper Pulls

1. Stock: Black
2. Barrell Length: Not to exceed 18.25"
3. Gauge: 12
4. Finish: Parkerized
5. Full pistol grip buttstock
  - i. Black
  - ii. polymer construction
6. 2 shot magazine extension tube
7. Tactical fore-end flashlight with momentary pressure pad and toggle switch ON/OFF applications
  - i. Tactical run time 3.0 hours
  - ii. Bezel Diameter 1.25"
  - iii. Not to exceed 1.1 lbs with batteries
8. Combat Sight System, Ghost Ring Sights
9. Gear sling
  - i. Padded rear section
  - ii. 2" in line pad
10. Sling mount: Appropriate method and Hardware to attach the shotgun.



# EXHIBIT C

## NAVAJO NATION CERTIFICATION Regarding Debarment and Suspension

Applicant acknowledges that to the best of his/her knowledge that their company and principal participants on this contract:

1. Are not debarred, suspended, or otherwise slated for debarment, ineligible and/or excluded from participation on Federal, State, and Tribal Government contracts etc.
2. Are not presently nor have been under criminal indictment or civilly charged by a governmental entity (Federal, State, and Tribal Government) for fraud, forgery, falsification, theft, bribery, destruction of records, receiving stolen property and other criminal offenses in the administration of a government contract.
3. Have not been terminated for cause or convenience by a governmental entity in the administration of a government contract (Federal, State, and Tribal Government).
4. If the Navajo Nation determines that the Certificate provided herein is not true, it will be grounds to terminate the contract and pursue other legal remedies.
