Navajo Treaty of 1868

The Navajo Treaty of 1868 was signed on September 9, 1868, in Fort Stanton, New Mexico. It was the first treaty signed between the Navajo Nation and the United States. The treaty established the Navajo Reservation in eastern Arizona and western New Mexico. It also recognized the Navajo as a sovereign nation and granted them the right to self-governance. The treaty is a significant part of Navajo history and is celebrated annually on September 9th.

Gateway to Canyon De Chelly National Monument

The Navajo People call this area Co'ni'í which means "Where the water flows out" to describe the location of the water flowing out from Canyon de Chelly. The Chinle community is situated in the center of the Navajo Nation and was established after the Navajo People returned from the Long Walk when thousands of Navajos were forced from their homes to march over 300 miles to Ft. Sumner, New Mexico. After the Treaty of 1868 was signed, Navajos returned to their homelands and many families came back to this area. Chinle serves as the Gateway to Canyon de Chelly where the canyon has provided food, water and shelter for groups of people for over 5,000 years. Spider Rock is one of the most notable areas in the park. A Welcome Center is located at the entrance of the park featuring maps and a bookstore. Chinle is located in Apache County in the northeast corner of Arizona with a resident population of about 5,000 and provides services for more than 8,000 surrounding residents.
