# GENERAL INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES FOR THIS RFP

- I. DESCRIPTION OF THE ORGANIZATION. The Department of Resource Enforcement (DRE) is a Department under the Division of Natural Resources and provides Natural Resource Law Enforcement services across the Navajo Nation.
- II. SCOPE OF THE CONTRACT. The Resource Enforcement Department intends to enter into a professional services contract with one (1) responsive, qualified, and independent contractor to complete all work as described in the attached scope of work.
- III. RESPONDENT REQUIREMENTS. All respondents must have the capabilities listed herein, including sufficient detailed information with regard to experience and expertise in meeting the following requirements:
  - 1. A legitimate and credible vendor with a minimum of five (5) years experience and history with providing the described services.
  - 2. The Navajo Business Opportunity Act, 5 N.N.C. §§ 201, 205, will apply.
  - 3. All workmanship and materials shall comply with applicable Safety Codes.
  - As built drawings of all completed work.
  - 5. Cannot have any Debarments and Suspensions from past projects.
- IV. SCOPE OF WORK. See Attached Description
- V. REQUIREMENTS. The respondent will furnish all requested information as specified in the RFP.
- VI. PROPOSAL CONTENT AND REQUIRED INFORMATION.

  - The Navajo Nation Department of Resource Enforcement (DRE) reserves the right to interview respondents if deemed necessary due to tied scores or other legitimate matters.
    - a. This may entail a presentation from the respondent for clarification and/or details on work products or other requirements. The presentation will be scheduled to be held in Window Rock, Arizona (if necessary). It is DRE's intention to award one (1) vendor to provide all services as specified.
- VII. TYPE OF CONTRACT. The Navajo Nation will utilize a standard professional services contract for the procurement of goods and services for this project.
- VIII. PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE. The period of performance will be determined and negotiated based on the schedule proposed by the respondent and the contract implementation date.
- IX. TECHNICAL DIRECTION. The Navajo Nation Resource Enforcement point of contact is Ms. Hope Wilson, Department Manager III. Ms. Wilson will answer all questionsfor inquiries related to the project and other matters. Questions and responses will be shared with all respondents. - X. PAYMENT AND SUBMISSION OF INVOICES. The Navajo Nation Professional Services Contract will describe this section.
- XI. RIGHTS. The Navajo Nation reserves the right to reject any and all proposals, in whole or in part, based on the requirements set forth in this RFP.
- XII. AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS. The Navajo Nation is not bound to enter a contract under the RFP and may issue a subsequent RFP for the same services. The Navajo Nation is a sovereign government and all contracts entered into as a result for the RFP shall comply with the Navajo Nation law, rules and regulations, including the Navajo Preference in Employment Act, as well as applicable federal law, rules, and regulations. This procurement and any RFP with respondents that may result, shall be governed by the laws of the Navajo Nation and applicable federal law. Nothing herein shall be constructed as a waiver of the Navajo Nation's sovereign immunity. In addition, the Navajo Nation Business Opportunity Act will apply to the RFP. The

Navajo Nation Professional Services Contract will provide all other legal and contractual obligations, terms, and requirements of this project.

# SCOPE OF WORK Spay/Neuter 2022

The Department of Resource Enforcement is seeking a qualified organization to manage a Pet Incentive spay/neuter drive on the Navajo Nation to assist in addressing the 250,000-pet over-population crisis in most Navajo Nation communities.

- 1. Pay incentive payments to individuals to obtain pet spay and neuter services that reside within the boundaries of the Navajo Nation.
- 2. Verify information from spay/neuter clinics or veterinarians and ensure spay or neuter services have been conducted, which will Include microchipping of pets.
- 4. Work with the Department of Resource Enforcement in organizing and facilitating the incentive payments.
- 5. Provide statistical and project end report of services provided. An accurate and detailed accounting of all purchases made with the funding provided. Allow the Department to view all receipts and sub-contract receipts to verify payments.
- 6. Contractor will submit an invoice detailing services to be completed.
- 7. The remaining 10% of administration fees of the contract will be paid once the final report is received and approved by the Department of Resource Enforcement. The final report format will be agreed upon by both entities. Pictures of services provided and related outreach materials will be provided to the Department along with the final report.
- 9. A proposed timeline from inception to completion of the project.
- 10. Cost detailed breakdown will include a listing of all projected expenses to complete the pet incentive project. Please be cognizant that the grand total is the contract total. If equipment is purchased, submit a listing of all equipment and supplies purchased, as well as, an inventory once the project is completed.
- 12. Exclusions: Based on your expertise- please list any and all other requirements not listed in this scope of work. (Do not list costs with main proposal).
- 13. Media platform to promote the pet incentive spay/neuter project and spay/neuter education.
- 14. Media platform for humane pet education.
- 15. Include resumes, background for organization, and any subcontractors.

# Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Contracting Eligibility

- 1. Applicant entity acknowledges that to the best of its knowledge that the Applicant entity, either in its present form or in any identifiable capacity, has not, in accordance with 12 N.N.C. § 361:
  - A. Been convicted of the commission of criminal offenses incident to obtaining or attempting to obtain a public or private contract or subcontract, or in the performance of any such contract or subcontract;
  - B. Been convicted of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, receiving stolen property, or other offenses indicating a lack of business integrity or honesty, which currently, seriously, and directly affect responsibility as a Navajo Nation contractor;
  - C. Been convicted under antitrust statutes arising out of the submission of bids or proposals;
  - D. Violated contract provisions, including:
    - i. Deliberate failure, without good cause, to perform in accordance with the contract specifications or within the time limit provided in the contract,
    - ii. A recent record of failure to perform or of unsatisfactory performance with the terms of any contract, or
  - iii. Any other cause so serious and compelling as to affect responsibility as a Navajo Nation contractor, including debarment by another governmental entity.
- 2. Applicant acknowledges that if the Navajo Nation determines that the executed Certification provided herein is untrue or not wholly accurate, it shall be grounds for the Navajo Nation to terminate the contract and pursue other legal remedies, at the Navajo Nation's discretion.
- 3. Applicant certifies to the best of its knowledge that it is eligible to do business with the

Navajo Nation, in its present form or in any other identifiable capacity, pursuant to 12 N.N.C. § 1501 and 5 N.N.C. § 301. Applicant also acknowledges that per 12 N.N.C. § 1505, it will not be eligible to contract with the Navajo Nation if deemed ineligible by the appropriate department or entity of the Navajo Nation which receives the Applicant's request for consideration for a business opportunity.
